“We also facilitate cross-referrals to our team of allied health professionals, making ours a truly holistic clinic.

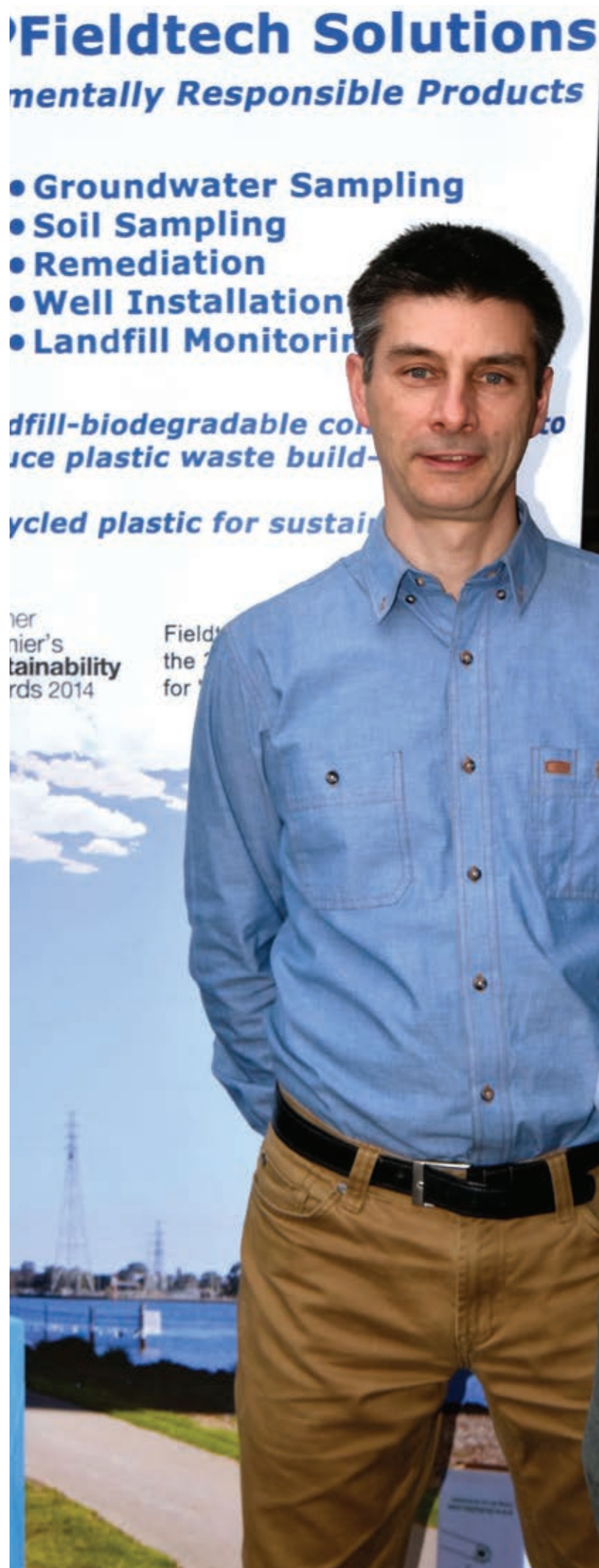
Tyron’s vision is to set the standard in healthcare, not just provide a “standard” service.

"We also hope to create and deepen relationships with a variety of health and fitness centres in our region.

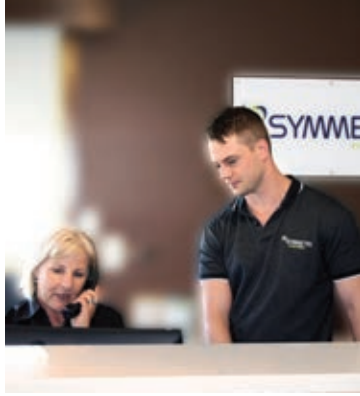

Logistics Freight Assist Australia Pty Ltd

When Freight Assist Australia Pty Ltd launched in 2012, managing director Dean Wrigley says they rented a corner of a warehouse shared with a business colleague who wanted to help give the company a start. It began with just five employees and has grown to such an extent that Freight Assist's depot in Sydney had to move into a much larger facility. The company offers interstate transport of bulk and dangerous goods Australia-wide. The family-owned business takes pride in providing old-fashioned service and Dean says everyone has worked incredibly hard to get where they are today. He's also chuffed with a new IT system they have under development that will improve efficiencies, including scanning of freight, pallet control and instant proof of deliveries.



Manufacturing and Industrial (small) Fieldtech Solutions

Launched in 2012, Fieldtech Solutions (trading as BioGone) is producing more sustainable and responsible products for use in industry to prevent land contamination. Co-owner Dr Ross Headifen says they started replacing single-use plastic products with landfill-biodegradable versions, and for longer-life items, recycled plastic resin. BioGone now produces landfill-biodegradable tubing, filters, groundwater sampling devices, gloves and some pump components. Rubbish bags, packing materials, dry cleaning bags and food packs are produced for general consumers, and, after years of research, BioGone is the only company in the world producing biodegradable packing tape.



Manufacturing and Industrial (Medium – Large) Mobil Altona Refinery

Mobil Altona Refinery has been fuelling Victoria at Altona since 1949. The modern day Mobil provides high-skilled employment, innovative career training and staff development programs, and a commitment to education that extends to local schools and community through its Bright Future STEM program. The judges noted the focus on innovation, leadership, sustainability and community. In value terms, Mobil Altona Refinery continues to thrive, contributing approximately \$270 million to the Victorian economy every year.



New/Start Up (up to 2 years old) Sebastian

Opened in late 2018, Sebastian is a stunning addition to Melbourne's west dining scene. Owned by Alex Brawn and Dave Parker, Sebastian is inspired by the Basque cuisine of northern Spain's San Sebastian and is in a sublime locale within a literal step of the sand and sea. Sebastian has transformed the former Shelly's Beach Pavilion premises into a gorgeous restaurant, with food and ambience getting very positive reviews from well-regarded sources. General manager Alex counts as one of the business's proudest achievements so far the development of their mostly young, local staff, two of whom are moving from kitchen hands to chef apprenticeships.



Not for Profit Williamstown Community and Education Centre Inc

Established 45 years ago as a mums craft and discussion group, not-for-profit Williamstown Community and Education Centre is now a community centre, a registered training organisation and a childcare provider with 20 staff, 22 volunteers, 200 students and 100 children who participate in programs that range from counselling and meditation to music programs and yoga – among others. Chief executive Dr Mark Brophy is proud the centre exceeded a state-wide satisfaction survey for students, and is equally chuffed with the innovative English language program for children, and refugees who may be ineligible for government assistance.



Retail Habitat Pet Supplies

Initially launched in 2012 by Dean and Rachelle Pantalleresco and in Altona in 2017, Habitat welcomes customers – with pets in tow – to check out a large range of products and accessories. Dean says whether it's trimmings for fish tank or reptile enclosure, a perch for birds, a hutch for rabbit or guinea pig, or feeding bowls, leads, bells and whistles, Habitat has the lot. "We also have two DIY dog washes – or dogs can be brought in for a pamper at our grooming salon," Dean says. "We have an amazing team of animal lovers and we're looking forward to introducing more unique products." Plastic bags have been eliminated and other green measures will be introduced.



Tourism Gourmet Pawprints

Gourmet Pawprints® was launched in August 2013 by owner Kerry Watt to offer fur-parents and their pooches Doggy Winery Tours®. The business has grown to include a range of dog-friendly experiences throughout Victoria. Each tour is designed to bring effortless adventures with your dog. Gourmet Pawprints was a Victorian Tourism finalist in 2017 and 2018 and has been awarded Trip Advisor Certificates of Excellence in 2016, 2018 and 2019.



Trades and Construction Southern States Group

Privately owned and operated by the Partington and Taylor families since 1993, Southern States Group became an Anteo dealer in 1999, a national dealer of Thermo King Rail Australia in 2011, and appointed a national dealer of Whiting Doors in 2017, as well as carried out work for Metro, Yarra and Sydney trains. The company has received global recognition. Managing director Wayne Taylor says the company provides world's best equipment, tech solutions and heating, venting and air-conditioning (HVAC) services to Australian transport in rail refrigeration, air cargo and trams, roller shutter doors and tail lift industries.
